Can you pick a sound and find as many objects as possible in the house or in the garden with that sound in. <p>For example: /ea/ sound: bead, reading book, peas.</p> <p>Once you have found the objects, create a poster showing all the objects with your chosen sound.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write a setting description of the South Pole in Antarctica, from the story Lost and Found. Learning Projects - to be done throughout the week

This year is the 90th anniversary of Amy Johnson's solo flight to Australia, which took place on 5th – 24th May. Over the coming weeks we will be looking at some of the countries that Amy landed in on her famous journey. <http://amyjohnsonartstrust.co.uk/amys-flight-from-england-to-australia/>

Geography: The second country we are going to look at on Amy Johnson's world record breaking flight is Iraq.

Using the atlas page, locate Iraq on the maps below. You could also plot it on your world map from Week 1.

Find out the following information about the country of Iraq:

What is the capital city?

Which countries border Iraq?

What is the population of Iraq?

What is the weather like in Iraq?

What date did Amy Johnson land in Iraq?

Amy made an unexpected landing in a desert in Iraq. Can you find out what made her have to land there?

Science: Over the year we have observed the changes over time in the seasons. We have looked at what the weather is like, what the plants look like and what activities you would like to do in that season. The season we are going to look at this week is: **Spring**.

Can you look out of a window or go outside into your garden and have a look at the weather.

Is it hot? Is it cold? Is the sun out? Is it raining? Is it cloudy?

What do the plants and trees look like? What colour are the leaves on the trees?

In Spring, what would you like to do?

Would you: Go on a bike ride? Go on an Easter Egg hunt? Go to the park?

Record your answers on a piece of paper all about Spring. It could be a poster or a fact file.

Art: In 2016, 59 sculptures of Moths were designed, made and put up in places in and around Hull.

They were to celebrate Amy Johnson's flight across the world in her plane, called a Gypsy Moth.

At school we use these Reading Dogs to help pupils remember and apply the different skills needed for reading comprehension tasks.

Your child should be familiar with them and be able to apply them to answer questions about a text they have read.



Sequencing Suki likes everything in order! She will help you sequence the events in a text.



Vocabulary Victor will help you to look at how authors and poets have chosen to use certain words and phrases.

Rex Retriever will help you to go into a text and retrieve the facts.



Inference Iggy will help you hunt for clues in a text about how someone might be feeling or why something is happening.




Predicting Pip tries to see the future and she will help you work out what might happen next.

These video Phonics Lessons are fantastic!

They follow the same structure as our lessons at school, so will be easy for your child to follow and join in with. At school, we start each day with our Phonics lessons, so this may a nice way to start your day at home too.

This week, as well as recapping some of the Phase 5 sounds that we already know, Lesson 7 will look at a new way to spell a sound too.

This is what we should be doing in our Phonics lessons at this point in the school year.

A helpful reminder of some of terminology used in Phonics lessons is below.
We encourage the children to use these terms correctly too.

Phoneme - A sound.

Grapheme - A sound written down.

Digraph - When 2 letters make 1 sound. E.g. ay

Trigraph - When 3 letters make 1 sound. E.g. igh

Setting Description




Year 1 Weekly Spellings


