Curriculum News

Our topic this term is 'Dinosaur Discovery'



As Artists and Designers we will:

Be using ICT to create and manipulate digital images of Dinosaurs, and using these to make their own compositions.

We will also be using a variety of Art skills during the Topic, such as printing, collage and painting to make our own pieces of Art.

During our Design Technology sessions, design and make a transportation device to move Dinosaur bones after they have been excavated!

As Scientists we will:

Be exploring and comparing the differences between living, dead and things that have never lived.

We will be identifying and naming a variety of animals and their habitats and looking at how they provide for animals basic needs. We will also learn about simple food chains and their sources of food.

As Geographers we will:

Use maps and plans to locate where in the world Dinosaur bones have been discovered! We will complete an analysis between some of the different locations bones have been found, to help us understand why dinosaurs lived in those places.

As Historians we will:

Take a look at the Dinosaurs of the past and the types and varieties of dinosaurs that have been discovered! We will look at the different periods in the Dinosaur Era and plot these on timelines. We will also look at the life and work of Mary Anning and see how her work affected what we now know about Dinosaurs!

As Mathematicians we will:

Be embedding our understanding of place value and using these skills to develop and refine the formal methods of addition and subtraction. We will also continue to learn and use our times tables and their division facts through our basic skills sessions.

As part of our cross curricular approach to learning, we shall be reading and analysing information presented in charts and tables.

As Authors and Readers we will:

Be learning about the different grammatical features we use in English and how we can utilise them in our writing. We will be writing stories, character descriptions, setting descriptions, letters, instructions, along with many others as the term moves on.
