Summer: 1<sup>st</sup> Half Term



SPARKS – Weekly cooking activities. Visit to Pizza Express. Butterflies.

As Communicators we will develop our conversational skills by learning how to take it in turns to speak, and to respond to questions.

We will be developing our vocabulary by learning new words and exploring the meaning of them.

We will be using story language and retelling stories. We will listen to and learn nursery rhymes, and we will use non-fiction books to help us develop our knowledge and understanding of the world around us.

In PSED we will be learning about relationships. We will talk about family life and friendships.

We will learn that friendships that friendships can change and that sometimes we can fall out with our friends. We will explore how this makes us feel and how we can solve disagreements.

We will discuss what it means to be and good friend and we will talk about bullying; what it is and what we can do about it. As Readers and Writers we will be linking our literacy with our topic and exploring books relating to our experiences. Our driving texts will be 'The Little Red Hen' and 'The Bad Tempered Ladybird'.

We will be consolidating our knowledge of phase 2 and 3 sounds. We will be developing our fluency in reading simple words and sentences.

We will be developing our writing skills and using these skills when completing tasks independently.

# Let's Grow

As Mathematicians we will be developing our understanding of what numbers are. We will learn about numbers 11-20 and will develop our understanding of place value.

We be consolidating our understanding of addition and subtraction and will learn how to do this using numbers to 20.

We will be exploring shape and learning about how we can put shapes together to make new shapes.

We will be exploring how we use Maths in the world around us.

In developing our Understanding of the World we will be learning about different types of plants, what they need to grow and why plants are important.

We will be learning about a range of mini beasts; we will learn about their life cycles, why they are important and how we can look after them.

As part of our Physical Development we will be developing our fine motor skills and developing a fluent handwriting style.

We will be developing our gross motor skills through a wide range of physical activities. PE sessions will focus on dance, where the children will move in time with the music.

Through Expressive Arts and Design we will be exploring a wide variety of media and materials. We will work independently to make our own creations, and we will follow instructions to develop specific skills. We will also create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills.

We will be developing our imaginative play by engaging in role play and small world play. We will be singing familiar songs and learning new ones. We will engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.

Describe what they see, hear and feel when outside.

Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.

Understand why plants are important to our environment and what we can do to protect them and help them grow.

Understand why mini beasts are important to our environment and what we can do to protect them and care for them.

# Physical Development

In PE, we will be learning how to use dance to help us express ourselves. To develop our fine motor skills, we will be threading, tweezing, using molding materials and using a range of mark making materials. We will be developing our pencil grip, letter formation and handwriting style.

# Expressive Arts and Design

Through art, music and dance, children in FS2 will be learning to express themselves in different ways. They will be introduced to the skills needed to do this, and they will revisit and refine these skills throughout the year.

We will learn about the different parts of our bodies and how they change as we grow.

We will explore the idea of growth and change in relation to moving to Year 1. We will talk about any worries and things we are excited about, and we will celebrate what we have achieved this year. As Readers and Writers we will be linking our literacy with our topic and exploring books relating to our experiences. Our driving texts will be 'Farmer Duck' and 'Elmer'.

We will be developing our decoding skills so that we can read confidently and we will be developing our comprehension skills. We will be developing how writing skills to ensure that we can write simple words and phrases that can be read by others.

### Big and Small

As Mathematicians we will be developing our understanding of numerical patterns, including doubling, halving, sharing and grouping.

We will be exploring the concepts of odd and even, and will begin to count in 2s,

We will be deepening our understanding of number by applying our knowledge to problem solving situations.

We will be developing our spatial reasoning skills through maps and mazes.

In developing our Understanding of the World we will be learning about different types of animals.

We will be exploring pets; which animals make appropriate pets and about how we care for them.

We will learn about farms and farm animals, about nocturnal animals, about animals that fly and swim, and about animals that live in other parts of the world.

As part of our Physical Development we will be refining our letter and number formation.

We will use our Outdoor Continuous Provision to develop gross motor skills through physical activities such as den building, climbing and balancing.

PE sessions will focus on skipping with ropes and athletic skills including running, jumping and throwing.

Through Expressive Arts and Design we will be exploring a wide variety of media and materials. We will work independently to make our own creations, and we will follow instructions to develop specific skills.

We will be developing our imaginative play by engaging in role play and small world play. We will be singing familiar songs and learning new ones.
