As Scientists we will:

Learn about forces and magnets. We will investigate magnetic materials and record our work scientifically. We will also learn about plants and their life cycles.

As Geographers we will:

We will find out about routes used by the Spanish Armada.

We will develop our map skills further by learning how to use four figure grid references.

As Artists and Designers we will:

Design, develop and evaluate a sewn Tudor money purse that incorporates a draw string. We will also be developing our painting skills by using Holbein's portrait of Henry VIII as a starting point for our own portraits.

As Authors and Readers we will:

Write a narrative ending inspired by our class text, "A Midsummer Night's Dream" by William Shakespeare. We will also be creating non-chronological report based on our learning about the Tudors.

We will continue to develop our skills in reading comprehension. We will also be developing our inference skills.

As Historians we will:

Study the Tudor period and its key events and developments. We will look at everyday life and use a range of evidence to make deductions about the past.

As Musicians we will:

Learn the song, "Bringing us together" to explore the dimensions of music. We will begin to learn the duration of a wider range of notes and use them to play instruments.

As Linguists we will:

Learn how to say 10 fruits and vegetables in Spanish.

In R&W we will:

Be learning about Eid and also what the meaning of sacred is.

In Summer 2, we will be visiting Gurdwara to learn about the Sikh place of worship.

In PE we will:

Learn how to play basketball by developing necessary skills and a knowledge of the rules. We will also be developing out athletic skills in preparation for Sports Day.

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As Mathematicians we will:

Continue to develop our skills and confidence in using the four operations in a variety of contexts.

We will develop our knowledge and understanding of 2D and 3D shapes, time, measures of length, mass and capacity.
